2020-21 HIGHLIGHTS

In October 2020, Jennifer Rodriguez received the Outstanding Advocate of the Year Award from the Florida Council Against Sexual Violence for her work as the Director of Sexual Assault Services.

Jennifer Rodriguez was appointed Chief Executive Officer in March of 2021. For 7.5 years, she was the Director of Sexual Assault Services at Quigley House, where she lead the Sexual Assault Response Team, including the sexual assault forensic exam program.

In April 2021, we successfully hosted our Annual Wine Gala for Sexual Assault Awareness Month and raised over \$25,000 for survivors and our programs.

In 2021, Quigley House received the **Celebrate Clay Judge's Choice Program Award** from the Reinhold Foundation.

Last year, Quigley House awarded \$8,672.75 in Thrift Store vouchers to survivors in Clay County. This program provides household items and furnishings to survivors in their new homes.

Quigley House received the 2021 Best of Clay Non-Profit Organization Award from Clay Today.
